Portions of Main Street and College Avenue will be closed to through traffic in Olde Town Conyers on the evening of Wednesday, October 31, 2018, from 5:30 p.m.-8:00 p.m. In recent years, the Olde Town residential area has become a popular location for trickor-treating.

The Latest on City Hall

In May, city voters cast ballots in favor of a bond to fund the construction of a new city hall, renovations to the existing Conyers Police Department and construction of a dedicated municipal court building at the current location of city hall. Since then, work has been taking place behind the scenes to purchase remaining parcels of land needed to build the new city hall on O'Kelly Street.

A bid process was held this summer for the selection of the architecture and construction firms. Once the firms are announced, work will begin in earnest to begin designing the new city hall that is expected to break



ground in the spring.

Hardin/O'Kelly Street Project: The Roundabout is Open— What's Next?

If you didn't hear the shouts of excitement and sighs of relief in early September, you may have missed the announcement that the new roundabout at O'Kelly Street and Oakland Avenue is open. So what's next for the project?

The project length is 0.77 miles, beginning at the intersection of Hardin Street and Dogwood Drive and ending at the intersection of O'Kelly Street and Green Street. Construction will now shift to Hardin Street at Dogwood Drive and progress is expected to be made from that intersection up to the Oakland roundabout over the next few months.

Sidewalk work, backfilling, repaving, and landscaping are now underway and may result in intermittent delays and traffic control in the months ahead. Weather permitting, the estimated completion date for the entire project is summer 2019.
